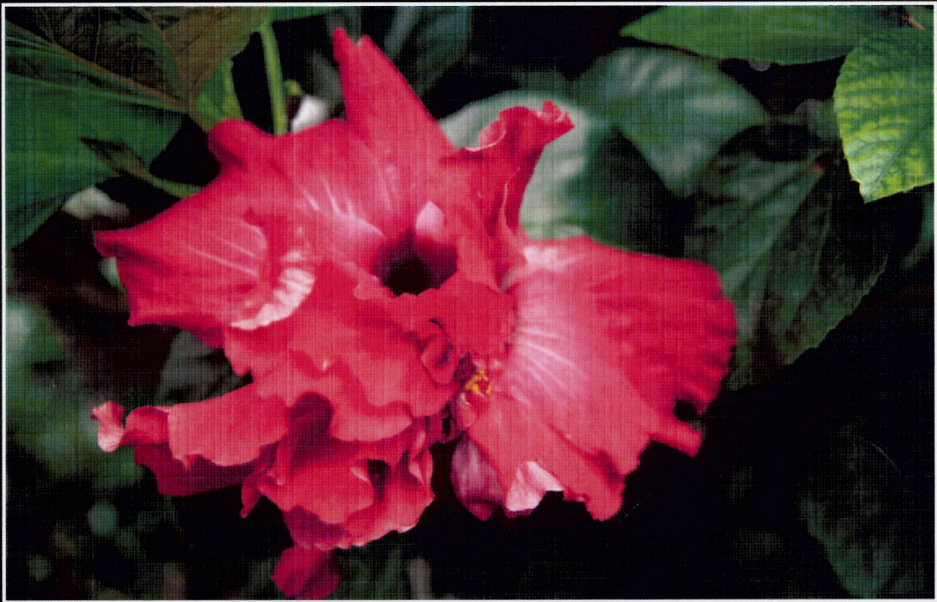
Dear Krish,

The Carleton University Hibiscus (*Rosa Sinises*)

The flower was developed by Renee Galioto, a volunteer at Carleton's greenhouse in 1998-1999, from Australian hybridized cuttings. The red and black flower is named after Carleton University and bears the institution's official colours. A celebration was held in the spring of 2000 behind Robertson Hall with then president Richard Van Loon to introduce this special bloom. The hibiscus was sold through the Canadian Tire for Families Foundation to benefit a bursary for botany students at Carleton.
